



Pacific Crest Trail

One of the most performed composers of concert band music, Robert Sheldon's compositions are performed around the world and appear on many international concert and contest lists. With over three million copies of his compositions and books sold, Dr. Sheldon regularly accepts commissions for new works, and produces numerous publication for concert band and orchestra each year.

When Michael Burch-Pesses asked Robert Sheldon to consider accepting a commission from the Northwest Bandmasters Association, he suggested a "northwest" theme would be nice but not required. But as he began thinking about this beautiful area of our country, he remembered hiking portions of the Pacific Crest Trail near Mt. Shasta, Mt. Hood and the mountains near Lake Tahoe and Palm Springs. It is hard not to be inspired by the majestic peaks and sweeping views experienced by visiting those wonderful places.

"The Pacific Crest Trail spans 2,650 miles (4,265 kilometers) from Mexico to Canada through California, Oregon, and Washington. It reveals the beauty of the desert, unfolds the glaciated expanses of the Sierra Nevada, travels deep forests, and provides commanding vistas of volcanic peaks in the Cascade Range."

"Pacific Crest" is inspired by the ridge of mountains spanning the entire range from Canada to the Mexican border, with music depicting the peaks, panoramic views, and joy of hiking this incredible trail.
